


chromatography using epitope-specific immunogen. **Concentration:** 1 mg/ml -15°C to -25°C/1 year(Do not lower than -25°C) **Storage Stability:** Observed Band: 45-52kD MAPK ERK Growth; MAPK G Protein; VEGF; Neurotrophin; **Cell Pathway: Background:** This gene encodes a member of the Ser/Thr protein kinase family. This kinase is regulated through direct phosphorylation by p38 MAP kinase. In conjunction with p38 MAP kinase, this kinase is known to be involved in many cellular processes including stress and inflammatory responses, nuclear export, gene expression regulation and cell proliferation. Heat shock protein HSP27 was shown to be one of the substrates of this kinase in vivo. Two transcript variants encoding two different isoforms have been found for this gene. [provided by RefSeq. Jul 2008], **Function:** catalytic activity:ATP + a protein = ADP + a phosphoprotein.,enzyme regulation: Seems to be activated by two distinct pathways: the first involves the stimulation of p42/p44 MAPK by growth factors, the second, triggered by stress and heat shock, depends on the activation of MPK2 and upstream MAPKK/MAPKKK.,function:Its physiological substrate seems to be the small heat shock protein (HSP27/HSP25). In vitro can phosphorylate glycogen synthase at 'Ser-7' and tyrosine hydroxylase (on 'Ser-19' and 'Ser-40'). This kinase phosphorylates Ser in the peptide sequence, Hyd-X-R-X(2)-S, where Hyd is a large hydrophobic residue (By similarity). Mediates both ERK and p38 MAPK/MAPK14 dependent neutrophil responses. Participates in TNF alphastimulated exocytosis of secretory vesicles in neutrophils. Plays a role in phagocytosis-induced respiratory burst activity.,PTM:Phosphorylated and activated by MAP k Subcellular Cytoplasm . Nucleus . Phosphorylation and subsequent activation releases the autoinhibitory helix, resulting in the export from the nucleus into the cytoplasm.
