



Background :	The NKX family of homeodomain proteins controls numerous developmental processes. Members of the NKX6 subfamily, including NKX6-3, are involved in development of the central nervous system (CNS), gastrointestinal tract, and pancreas (Alanentalo et al., 2006 [PubMed 16326147]).[supplied by OMIM, Mar 2008],
Function :	function:Putative transcription factor, which may be involved in patterning of central nervous system and pancreas.,similarity:Contains 1 homeobox DNA-binding domain.,


